



Maryville Visitation Policy *(Updated 5-24-21)*

Visits to Maryville do not need to be scheduled, however,

- Visitation may be suspended at any time as outlined in guidance from the Oregon Health Authority and The Department of Human Services. Reasons for suspending visitation include:
 - A staff or resident is suspected of having, or has tested positive for, COVID-19.
 - The County positivity rate is greater than 10% **and** less than 70% of residents are vaccinated.
 - The resident is under a 14-day quarantine for COVID-19 related reasons. (No visits allowed during the first 14 days following admission for residents not fully vaccinated.)
 - The facility is under an Executive Order that restricts visitation.
- It is recommended that you call in advance to get an update on visitation status at Maryville to avoid being turned away upon arrival.
- Visitors must wear well-fitting face coverings at all times regardless of vaccination status.
- All visitors will be screened. We ask that you not visit if you have had any new COVID 19 symptoms in the past 48 hours or if in the past 14 days, you have had direct contact with someone who has tested positive for COVID 19 or who is being tested.
- Fully vaccinated residents can have close contact with their visitors as long as the resident and visitor are wearing well-fitting face coverings. Visitors should

continue to maintain 6-foot social distancing from all other residents and staff. Core Principles of COVID-19 infection control must be maintained.

- If the resident resides in a shared room, visits should occur in a common area unless the resident is unable to get out of bed. If a visit must occur in the room, visitors should observe the core principles of COVID-19 infection control which includes maintaining a 6-foot distancing from the other resident.
- Visitors are asked to remain in the resident's room or designated visitation area. Movement throughout the facility should be limited.
- If you have non-urgent questions about your loved one, we ask that you call after you leave Maryville and ask for the charge nurse on the unit, the resident care manager, or the social worker assigned to your loved one.
